Dorothy Ann Merritt departed from us on October 27, 2010 to begin that greater life with her Almighty God and Loved ones who preceded her. She was the first born to Julia Jacobs and William Messick of Watha, North Carolina on March 2, 1920. She was reared on a farm and learned the values of family, hard work, education, commitment to God and helping others. She exemplified these values throughout her life.

Dorothy, lovingly known as Dot, graduated from Burgaw Colored High School April 22, 1938. December 24, 1938, she married Joe Sam Merritt. They had two children, Josephine (Jo) and J.T. (Junior). Motivated to secure better education for them, the couple planned a move to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She went first in 1943 and secured work; he followed 1944; the children were left in the care of Sam's parents, Ollie and Joe Merritt.
