Obituary



Daphne Jacobs Goodwyn crossed into glory from her home in Chesapeake on December 22, 2018.

She was born September 20, 1931 to Willie H. and Mamie Herring Jacobs in Burgaw NC. After graduating C.F. Pope High School as salutatorian, she moved to Portsmouth VA to live with her beloved aunt Lillie Jacobs Coleman. She married James S. Goodwyn and they raised three sons: James Carnell, Tyrone Sidney, and Anton Raynard. She retired from Naval Air Reworks Facility in 1991 after twenty-five years' service as an aircraft electrician. She was renowned for her giving spirit at work, in the church and community and amongst her large, loving family.

Even with degenerative memory loss, she continued to be a caring, graceful, strong woman; and reaped the

rewards of a family she had raised to follow her example. Her grandson Richard T. Goodwyn and his family moved into her home two years ago to provide steadily increasing care based on her changing needs. Toddler Jackson Carnell Goodwyn was a source of delight for her – “my baby”.

She was a devoted member of Noble Street Baptist Church for more than sixty years. She was a member of the Davidson Circle hospitality committee for over fifty years. Even as arthritis made standing and walking difficult, she stood in the entry, greeting every single visitor with warmth and love.
