Remembering ~ Reminiscing and Never Forgetting

Carrie Etta Herring Walker, of the Rhynes Crossroad Community was born to Julia Herring on September 30, 1900. Her Grandmother was Rachel Herring; Grandfather Murdock Gibson. Carrie had five (5) siblings: Berta Herring, C. J. Herring, Haston Herring, Eddie Tate and Lila Mae Tate.

Carrie Walker was reared by Grandma Rachel Herring and her maternal uncle, Arthur Herring and his

wife, Annie Walker Herring.

Carrie Etta Herring Walker was formerly educated at Love Grove School on Piney Wood Road. She was an avid reader and enjoyed a variety of literary works; often reciting by memory lengthy poems and scriptures learned throughout her life. The Holy Bible was her favorite book.

Carrie Herring was united in marriage to Joel Walker on May 20, 1916. She was preceded in death by

her loving husband of 56 years.

To this union, they were blessed with thirteen children, four of whom preceded her through the pearly

gates of heaven: Willie D. Walker, Cleveland Walker, Arbelvia Walker and Mae Ruth Calloway.

Survivors remaining to carry on her legacy and follow her exemplary footsteps are: Reginald Walker; Bertha Bannerman (Robert, deceased); Berneice Jacobs White (Clifford); Vivian Minatee (Leonard, deceased); Ray Walker, Juliette Goodwyn; Dolores Tyree (William, deceased), Carl Walker (Janet), Esther Brinson (James); a special granddaughter, Dian Walker and a number of others that she served as a surrogate mother; One hundred fifty (150) grandchildren, great grandchildren, great, great grandchildren and many nieces, nephews and cousins.

As the oldest person in the State of North Carolina and one of the sweetest in the world, Carrie Etta Herring Walker was cherished by all of Pender County. The Community of Rhynes Crossroad has suffered the great loss of a God fearing neighbor, friend and confidant. She will be mourned across the

Country by relatives and friends.

Carrie Etta Herring Walker claimed her victory on Saturday, January 8, 2011. Death is always a stranger. Even for a life that lasted longer than one hundred ten years. But none of us came here to stay and the best way we can honor her memory is to become the same hero for our children and grandchildren that she has been for us. She carried the torch of her family legacy and her faith. She put it down to pick up her crown. We now have to pick up the torch and carry it.

Reared in a Christian home, Carrie gave her heart to the Lord at nine years old and never stopped serving Him. On any given day, her joyous voice of song and tambourine of life resonated throughout

her home on Joel Walker Road.

As a lifetime member of New Hope Missionary Baptist Church she served on numerous Auxilaries, Boards and Church Organizations. To recall a few: Carrie sang on the Senior Choir beginning around 1949 when the Choir was organized; Worked with the Baptist Training Union; Served District 6, Group 1, of the Lower Pender Mission Union; Served as Sunday School Teacher; Treasurer of the Usher Board; President of the Pastor's Aide which was organized in 1970; Deaconess from 1949 until 1972; Provided a home to the Pastor(s) during annual revival services for numerous years; Served as President of the Daughters of Zion; Was a charter member of the Kenansville Eastern Missionary Baptist Association; Worked hard and loved the Lord. Carrie Etta Herring Walker lived a beautiful, Christian life.

Most importantly, she was and continues to be a beacon pointing us all to a steadfast, personal

relationship with God and a life that exhibits that relationship.

She did not suffer a lengthy illness. She revived and began to talk to people and sing to God—her normal behavior.

Literally, she sang, "I'm on my way to Canaan's Land.


