

## Rest In Peace



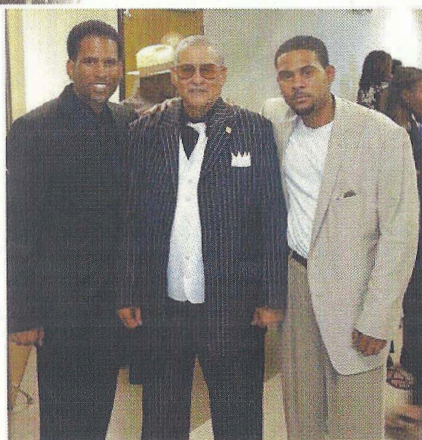
You are not forgotten my love

## OBITUARY

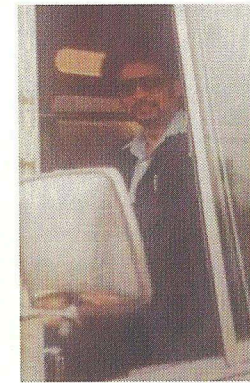
Leon David Bellamy, son of the late Mildred McKinney and Willie F. "Rock" Bellamy, was born October 5, 1944, in Manhattan, New York. He was the second born because his twin brother, "Leo", was born two minutes before him. Leon departed this life peacefully on Monday, June 1, 2015, at his home.
