### Obituary

Mr. Jesse Lee Walker, Jr. quietly and peacefully submitted to the final sleep January 11, 2006 at Sentara Leigh Hospital.

Jesse, affectionately known as "Redd" was born June 16, 1944 to the late Jesse Lee Walker, Sr. and Edna M. Walker, in Montgomery, Alabama, where he attended Nazareth Catholic Elementary, St. Judes Elementary, Billingslea Elementary, Carver Middle and Carver High Schools. Also through the Veterans Administration (VA) he requested that his eyes be donated to the eye bank located in Winston Salem, NC.
